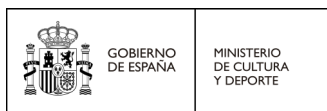


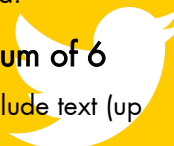
Participant Guide



Each speaker will post a thread (paper) about the chosen topic within the sphere of preventive conservation.

Each tweet will be a reply to the preceding one, so that the entire presentation is displayed together and in succession on Twitter. In order to make them easier to read in the prescribed order, each tweet must be numbered.

The thread will be made up of a minimum of 6 tweets and maximum of 12. They can include text (up to 280 characters), images, videos or GIFs.



The maximum time for creating the thread is 15 minutes. The anticipated time is one tweet per minute and a few final minutes to respond to possible questions, although it is possible that the conversation may arise after the presentation is completed.

It is essential to use the official hashtag (#PrevCon18) in each tweet so that all users can follow the conference live or do related searches afterwards.

It is advisable to include at least one initial introductory tweet and one final tweet with conclusions or a summary of the paper.

On the day of the conference, speakers must ensure that their account is not private and that their content is not protected, so that all users can see it.

Speakers may actively interact with all participants, converse and answer questions related to preventive conservation.

Although educational use applies, when multimedia content is shared, it is essential to have the necessary permission in terms of intellectual property rights.

We recommend that speakers keep the thread in their profile as a pinned tweet for at least a few days, making it easier for users to access the content.

Once the conference is over, the MNCV will be responsible for compiling all of the content generated so that it may be archived and accessible.
